The grant must be open to the industry at large and all advertising for the course must include the statement "This course is being funded in whole or in part by a grant from the Private Protective Services Board."

All awards issued shall be in compliance with and follow the guidelines of NCGS 74C-30. If you are interested in applying for a grant, please fill out the Grant Application with detailed explanation of the training course(s) you would like to hold complete with anticipated dates, a breakdown of expenses, estimated attendance and a description of the benefit this course(s) will provide for the private protection industry.

Applications will provide the Board's Training and Education Committee with detailed information about your proposed project that will be used to make a funding decision. Grants will be selected based on the needs, the number and variety of people expected to attend the training, and other applicable criteria as determined by the Private Protective Services Board.
