## Additional Resources

Department of Corrections labor may be available to cleanup storm debris; farmers can request assistance and get more details from their county Emergency Management (EM) office. A list of county EM offices can be found on the AgTAP website.

Financial assistance in the form of reimbursement may be available through county FSA Offices for debris pickup and fence repair; to apply visit your county Farm Service Agency office.

DOT debris removal is available for counties affected by the tornadoes including Bertie, Bladen, Craven, Cumberland, Currituck, Greene, Halifax, Hertford, Harnett, Hoke, Johnston, Lee, Onslow, Pitt, Robeson, Sampson, Wake, and Wilson.
