The 2020 and 2021 statewide juvenile justice system delinquency rate included 16- and 17-year-olds due to Raise the Age. 17.53 complaints per every 1,000 kids in the state of North Carolina **Complaints Received and Delinquency Rate 2011-2021**



Juvenile Intake

Juveniles can receive multiple outcomes (e.g., a complaint that was originally diverted, could later result in being approved for court). In 2021, these scenarios led to a juvenile count for the **"APPROVED FOR COURT," "DIVERTED"** and **"CLOSED"** classifications to total 11,296 youth, with 29,001 filed complaints.
