A PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS, community corrections professionals work with local law enforcement agencies to help keep our communities safe; and

WHEREAS, community corrections professionals are responsible for helping people involved with the criminal justice system become successful members of their communities; and

WHEREAS, community corrections professionals answer the daily call to aid in the reintegration of formerly incarcerated individuals as they reenter society; and

WHEREAS, working in partnership with community agencies and groups, these trained professionals provide services and support to people on probation, parole and community supervision; and

WHEREAS, more than 2,000 certified probation/parole officers serve the North Carolina Department of Public Safety, supervising approximately 90,000 justice-involved individuals in communities across the state, and

WHEREAS, North Carolina's community corrections officers, along with their counterparts across the nation, have made the commitment to be positive change agents in our communities by dedicating their time, energy, determination and competencies to public safety;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, ROY COOPER, Governor of the State of North Carolina, do hereby proclaim July 21-27, 2019, as "PROBATION, PAROLE, AND COMMUNITY SUPERVISION OFFICERS' WEEK" in North Carolina, and commend its observance to all citizens.
