

PURPOSE

This memo provides a quick reference to information from different divisions within the North Carolina Department of Correction. Information about the Department and its Divisions can be found on the web site (www.doc.state.nc.us).

SEX OFFENDER POPULATION STATISTICS

These statistics represent a snapshot of the sex offender population under DOC custody on a given day. Sex offender is defined as any person with a sex offense described in North Carolina GS 14-208.6. While the offenses listed in this statute are registerable offenses, not all persons defined as a sex offender in this memo are required to register if the offense preceded the registration requirement.

<p>The average age at admission for these inmates was 33 years. More than half (57.3%) have at least a high school diploma (or equivalent). Approximately one-half (50.2%) reported at admission to prison that they were single. The most frequent type of offense was first degree rape (23.4%), followed by second degree rape (20.9%), indecent liberty with child (19.3%) and first degree sexual offense (11.1%).</p> <p>Approximately one-third (35%) of these inmates were convicted of offenses against a minor. The most frequent convictions of these 1,736 inmates are indecent liberty with child (56%), 1st degree sexual offense with child (12%) and rape of a child less than age 13 (9.5%).</p> <p>Only one-quarter (21.8%) of sex offenders are serving a life sentence. The typical sex offender not sentenced to life was sentenced to 270 months (22.5 years) in prison.</p>

<p>The average age at intake for these offenders was 35 years. Fewer than half (48.8%) reported at least 12 years of education. Nearly half (49.2%) reported at intake to supervision that they were single. The most frequent type of offense was indecent liberty with child (58.8%), followed by sexual battery (8.6%), second degree rape (8.3%) and second degree sexual offense (5.8%).</p> <p>Nearly three-quarters (71.1%) of these offenders were convicted of offenses against a minor. The most frequent convictions of these 1,653 offenders are indecent liberty with child (82.8%), sex offense by substitute parent/guardian (7.0%) and second degree sexual exploitation of a minor (1.8%).</p> <p>The typical sex offender in the community was sentenced to 74 months (6.2 years) of supervision.</p>
