#### $\rightarrow$ 73 women with SUD

- → 35 women w/ Opioid Use Disorder (OUD)
- $\rightarrow$  10 women w/ OUD returned to jail or prison
- $\rightarrow$  2 women died of an overdose in <60 days
- → 3 women w/ SPMI returned to prison \*Since 2020

SUPPORTING WOMEN FOR SUCCESSFUL REENTRY

As an awardee of the Wake County National Opioid Settlement, Arise Collective will utilize the funding to support the expansion of the Women's Reentry Project Seven-Petal Program Model to provide a deeper level of evidence-based services and support to justiceinvolved women struggling with opioid use disorder.















- → 92% acquired IDs
- $\rightarrow$  62% engaged in therapy
- → 74% gained employment
- $\rightarrow$  25% accessed free dental care
- $\rightarrow$  10.3% car blessings from Wheels4Hope
- → 17.2% engaged in higher learning \*Since 2020
