# Overview

Transitional Housing is community based housing provided to adult offenders who are in need of a structured, positive, and safe environment as they gain the life skills necessary to achieve self-sufficiency and permanent housing.

The length of stay in Transitional Housing will be based on needs for a minimum of 90 days up to a maximum of 120 days.



## Facility Programs and Services

DAC Transitional Housing will provide community-based services that will address the needs of returning citizens to ensure successful reentry.

Transitional Housing offers some, but not limited to the below support services.

- Basic Necessities
- Life Skills Education
- Assistance Obtaining Vital Documents
- Relationship Building and Decision-Making Skills
- Education Services
- Employment Services
- Behavioral Health Services
- Physical Health Services
- Housing Assistance
- Transportation
- Residents will have access to participate in all components of NCDAC Transitional Housing.

## Requirements

- Participation must be voluntary
- Offender must be 18 years or older
- Offender must be homeless or have no home plan
- Under probation, parole, or post-release supervision for at least 90 days
- Offender must not have any severe mental health or medical conditions
- No current or prior arson or burning convictions
- Does not have family or community resources willing to assist with living arrangements
- Must be able to seek gainful employment
- Will cooperate with all rules of the TH, expected programs, and its partner agencies
